

Pattern Level: Intermediate

The Homebound Quilt is made up using the Log Cabin Block technique by adding strip piecing. However it does go beyond that by then cutting down the center to create a window glass effect on the quilt. This pattern does require many steps and will create biased edges, which is why I added the outside border strips on the quilt top to help control that for quilting. Pressing your seams flat to your preferred method will definitely help as you are building your blocks and adding your sashing. **Please Read** through the pattern Carefully, and make note where directions may extend based on the size quilt you are making.

Assumed WOF is 42" for Measurements


WOF - Width of Fabric

FQ- Fat Quarter

RST- Right Sides Together

Tools Needed:

- Rotary Cutter
- Ruler
- Cutting mat
- Mini Iron
- Wool Pressing mat



Fabric Cutting Notes: To make the quilt you will need to pull and cut Fabric 1, Fabric 2, Fabric 3 and the Background. The Fabric 1 (FQ version) and Fabric 1 (solid version) are interchangeable depending on which version you make. To see the solid version which is made up of only 3 prints/ colors see page 15. Make sure to only pull and cut one of the Fabric 1 options.
